The redevelopment of the Sechseläutenplatz with a fine natural stone surface made of Vals quartzite has received extensive approval. It lends the neighbourhood new vibrancy as a centre for young and old, for locals and tourists, for the staging of events, and for relaxing. In addition to the promenade beside Lake Zurich, which has long been popular and lively, the district attracts a diverse group of visitors every day. An increased frequency of train connections has also made Stadelhofen station an important transport node. Outside shop opening hours, life in the neighbourhood has also become livelier. The new Calatrava building that is planned and an extended S-Bahn station are sure to stimulate the location even further.

2010	Start of a series of Christmas markets in Sechseläutenplatz.
2007	Handing over the concession for the new underground car park.
2003	Being successfully involved in a referendum to accept the redesign of Sechseläutenplatz.
2002	Searching for investors to realise the Opéra underground car park. Campaigning for "Stadelhoferplatz for all" advocating for safety and cleanliness as well as for a petting zoo in the square.
2000	Participating in a working group for a competition to design the new Sechseläutenplatz.
1999	Crisis intervention to prevent formation of an open drug scene in Stadelhoferplatz, which provided the groundwork for the creation of "sip züri".
1998	Concession granted by the City Council for the construction and operation of an underground car park (public-private partnership) in front of the Opera House for 200 public and 50 private parking spaces – in accordance with the "historic compromise" of 1996.
1990	Renaming the association to "Bellevue and Stadelhofen Association". Opening of the S-Bahn network in the canton of Zurich and the upgrading of Stadelhofen station.
1975	Publication of "20 Postulates of the Zurich City Association".
1965	Founding member of the "Zurich City Association" umbrella organization.
1959	Establishing the association with the name "Bellevue Centre Association", modelled on the Zurich Bahnhofstrasse Association.
